Beaver Dam Lake Management Plan to be Presented at Annual Meeting August 22

Opportunity to hear and ask questions about the comprehensive Lake Management Plan that was developed for BDLIA with a grant from the DNR



Tim Hoyman of Onterra, the firm contracted to lead the project of developing a Lake Management Plan for Beaver Dam Lake, will present the findings and recommendations of the study and corresponding plan for the lake.

The meeting will be held on Sat., Aug. 22, 2015 at the Conservationist Club, W9554 County Trunk G, Beaver Dam. A free continental breakfast will be available beginning at 8:30 am with the meeting beginning at 9:00 am. While this presentation is part of the BDLIA membership annual meeting, the public is encouraged to attend. The presentation will explain the study results and the reasons why certain alternatives were selected for inclusion in the plan. Attendees will be encouraged to ask questions and express concerns.

Work on the development of this plan began in 2012 and was funded by grants from the DNR with additional financial support from BDLIA. The first phase of the project was extensive and in-depth studies including multiple plant surveys, water quality sampling, shoreline review and watershed investigations. The second stage was the development of lake management options to protect and enhance the important and sensitive areas of the lake and steps to be taken to improve the lake.

"This is an exciting step in meeting BDLIA'S mission of protecting and improving Beaver Dam Lake," stated Bill Foley, Vice President of BDLIA. "However, now comes the real work, the implementation of the many management action items to meet the goals of this Plan."

Annual Membership Meeting

The annual membership meeting of BDLIA will be held immediately following the Lake Management Plan presentation.



How Valuable is our Shoreline ?



One of the most valuable areas of a lake is the shoreline. When natural shoreline is changed it can severely increase pollutant loads. The removal of shoreland plants and natural vegetation also can cause shoreline erosion and reduces the habitat for fish and wildlife.

In an effort to reduce these harmful effects and obtain the benefits of more natural shoreline the BDLIA is taking the following actions:

- Participating in the Healthy Lakes Initiative (See Page 5)
- Planning a seminar/workshop series on Shoreline Protection and Restoration.

The seminar/workshop series will be a program where property owners will not only hear about how and what they can do to improve their shoreline and the advantages, but the step by step procedures to do this. In addition to the shoreline it also includes information about improving the fish habitat on their shoreline. They will find that it all doesn't have to be done at once and the cost can be minimal. The program will include the visiting of sites where other property owners have already completed such projects.

Some of the subjects to be included is information on rain gardens, water diversions, native plantings and a program for fish habitat called fish sticks. Spring Brought Abundance of Aquatic Plants

Property owners and users of Beaver Dam Lake were amazed at the growth of aquatic plants in Beaver Dam Lake this past spring.

Beaver Dam Lake in normal years has very limited vegetation, however, this spring, especially along the western shore, the lake had abundant vegetation. There was no conclusive evidence that any one factor caused this but rather a combination of many factors that has resulted in this unusual growth of aquatic plants.



One of the factors playing into this exceptional growth of aquatic plants is the relative clarity of the water so far this spring. Normal clarity of Beaver Dam Lake is about one foot. Most of this spring it has been in the range of three to five feet. Part of this clarity is attributable to the appreciable decline in the carp population and the onset of zebra mussel into Beaver Dam Lake.

In each of the last few years over one million pounds of carp have been removed by the commercial fishermen. Carp not only stir up the bottom through foraging for food and their spawning behavior, but their excretion increases the nutrients which create the algae and the reduced clarity.

The zebra mussels feed on algae and in lakes with high algae, like Beaver Dam Lake, water clarity normally improves.

"Beaver Dam Lake is an overly nutrient rich lake and when you combine this with water clarity, which allows the sun to reach the bottom of the lake, you have the recipe for aquatic plant growth," stated Bill Boettge, President of BDLIA.

The predominant aquatic plants now seen especially along the western shore of Beaver Dam Lake, is the curly-leaf pondweed. This is not a native plant and is an European exotic invasive species. It chokes out other native aquatic plants. It begins growing in early spring and dies back in late

June and early July. The die back can cause algae blooms and while deteriorating can dramatically lower oxygen in the lake. Its seeds lie dormant until fall when they germinate and produce winter foliage which thrives under the ice. Another reason for its abundance this spring is that the ice was very clear this past winter and we had limited snow on the ice allowing the curly-leaf pondweed to get a great start this spring.

While the curly-leaf pondweed hampers recreational activities on the lake it is beneficial for the fish population. Any plant, even curly-leaf pondweed, provides needed habitat for the fish population. Residents that have the plants growing in front of their shoreline report seeing and catching crappies, sunfish and bluegills.

Will the overabundance of curly-leaf pondweed happen again next spring? According to lake experts consulted by BDLIA what's going to happen next year cannot be predicted based upon what has happened the last two years. They state that the abundance of these plants can vary greatly from one year to the next.

The BDLIA is tentatively planning on doing a professional assessment of invasive aquatic plants as part of the Lake Management Plan that is now being formulated and from this assessment will determine if control strategies for these invasive plants are warranted.

Dodge County Lakes Group Moves to Broaden its Base




The Dodge County Lakes Group holds meetings to share information and ideas for maintaining and improving lakes and surface water in the County. In the last 18 months it has become a more active advocate for all aspects of clean water in the county, including ground and surface water. It met with state Assemblymen to advocate for better pollution control and published a brochure on the value of water.

This past spring the group realized that because it has taken on a broader role in its work as an advocate for clean water, the group needed to transition to a broader base. Clean water is something that concerns all county citizens. Therefore, to be an effective advocate for clean water the group needed representatives from business, industry, agriculture, the medical community—a multi stakeholder organization.


Ground Water...or What We Drink Each Day



Throughout Dodge County the drinking water that we rely on each day begins as 'Ground Water'. Rain and surface water enters the ground and seeps into porous rock below the surface, the aquifer, which holds the water for our wells to draw upon.

If your home is not on a city water system, your private well draws from the aquifer, below ground level, through the well casing pipe. Piping from the pump then brings the water into our homes for drinking, cooking, bathing and cloths washing. Some homes have added filters, to remove particles, or softeners to remove iron and odor.

In most cases this water is clean and safe to drink. Sometimes, however, contaminants can enter the ground water which results in an unsafe condition. Rain can move surface biological contaminants from manure and failed septic systems into wells, while forcing nitrates below the surface which enter the groundwater. WDNR recommends that the best way to insure your drinking water is safe is to take yearly samples for testing to identify that bacteria is not present and nitrates are within the range set by the WDNR (Not required if BD Municipal water supply).



For a nominal fee, sampling kits can be obtained from the Dodge County UW Extension office in Juneau. The water samples are then sent to UW Stevens Point for analysis to insure that it is safe for you to drink.

So make sure to test your water each year and enjoy this vital resource that is too often taken for granted.

Fish Programs

Fishing is a key activity on Beaver Dam Lake and BDLIA continues to support many activities enhancing the lake's fisheries.



Fish Stocking

BDLIA stocked over 9,000 four to six inch walleyes into Beaver Dam Lake this past April. This is part of the year round stocking effort by the association. In the fall of 2014, the association stocked over 25,000 perch, blue gill, bass and northern in the lake. Funds for the stocking are made possible in part by fishing tournaments on Beaver Dam Lake and the support by businesses and individuals of the association's annual fund raising banquet held each March.

The fish stocking program achieves four goals: 1) provide pan and game fish for fishing enthusiasts; 2) keep a balance in the lake's fish population; 3) provide predator fish to help control the rough fish population; and 4) help attract people to the lake to improve tourism economy in the area.

Lake Days

BDLIA sponsors a fish tournament and teams up with BDCAS to offer free pontoon boat rides and a Beaver Paddle Boat Regatta at upcoming a Lake Days.

Beaver Dam's annual Lake Days will be held on July 9 – 12 at Tahoe Park in Beaver Dam. Three exciting lake related events that were launched last year will again be offered as part of the Lake Days festivities.



The Beaver Paddle Cardboard Boat Regatta
Last year 17 teams competed for the coveted Beaver Paddle Trophy and the \$100 first prize money. They were cheered on by over 250 fans along the shoreline. This year's event, again co-sponsored by the City of Beaver Dam Community Activities and Services (BDCAS), will be held on Sunday, July 12, 2015 at Tahoe Park. It will begin at 10:00 am with check-in followed by boat building and the race at high noon. There is no entry fee. The teams will be given all materials needed including cardboard, duct tape and a box cutter. Each team is made up of three people one of whom must be 16 or older and the minimum age for the others is 5. A great event for families and youth organizations. Build teamwork and have a blast. Free Pontoon Rides on Beaver Dam Lake
People attending Lake Days will again be offered an opportunity to take a 30 minute ride on beautiful Beaver Dam Lake. Last year over 240 people, some of whom had never been on a boat and some who had never been on Beaver Dam Lake, gave the BDLIA volunteers who operated these free rides kudos for offering this service to people from the area. The rides will be offered on Saturday, July 11 from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm and from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm. On Sunday the rides will be offered from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. People wanting to participate will be asked to sign up at the BDLIA booth on the Lake Days grounds and will be assigned to one of two boats operating during these time periods. This event is also co-sponsored by the BDCAS.



Fishing Tournament

This event will be held on Saturday, July 11 with a 5:00 am check-in and ends at 12 noon. This year there is a \$500 guaranteed first place. There are two contests: 1) total length of 5 bass and 3 walleye and 2) biggest fish by length. Some of the rules are: two persons per boat, one rod per person, no motor trolling. Contest fees are \$25 per person/\$50 per boat. For complete listing of rules and a contest entry blank go to the BDLIA website bdlia.org or call Mike Gade at 920-344-5159. "Last year's event drew a nice group of contestants," stated Mike Gade chair of the event, "And with the guaranteed \$500 first place prize money this, we are expecting lots of sign-ups."

BDLIA Receives Healthy Lakes Grant

Five property owners on Beaver Dam Lake are participating in DNR initiative to improve shorelines.



The Beaver Dam Lake Improvement Association (BDLIA) received notification this past April that it was one of 13 statewide lake groups that was approved for five projects under the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) new Healthy Lakes Initiative.



Healthy Lakes Initiative is a new program that provides funds for projects to support installation of fish sticks to improve habitat, native plants or diversion practices along the shoreline to slow runoff, and upland practices like rain gardens that manage runoff from structures and impervious surfaces. Lakeshore property owners, municipalities and businesses complete the projects with grant funding of up to \$1,000. The BDLIA received \$4,320 from the DNR. In order to meet the grant's 25% match requirements, participating property owners will pay a portion of the costs or contribute volunteer time to compete their projects.

All five projects submitted by BDLIA were awarded grants. Four were for individual property owners and the fifth was for a City of Beaver dam project. The projects were for installation of

native plantings, diversion of runoff and a rain garden.

"We are very pleased to be one of the first groups state-wide to receive a grant under this new initiative," stated Bill Boettge, President of BDLIA. "It not only shows our property owners and City of Beaver Dam are interested in improving their properties but in helping protect Beaver Dam Lake. It also reflects positively on BDLIA that we are a lake association that is aggressively pursuing programs that will improve and protect Beaver Dam Lake."

Shown in the photo is a native planting project placed parallel to the lake shore by a property owner on Beaver Dam Lake. All 153 plants in this 350 square foot area are native plants that were selected from an approved list provided by the DNR. The purpose of the area is to improve wildlife habitat, slow runoff water and promote natural beauty.

The grant recipients have two years to complete their projects and sign agreements that they will meet the state guidelines for the projects and maintain the project for 10 years.

"The program will offer another opportunity to submit for grants next February," commented Bill Foley, Vice President of BDLIA. "We hope more property owners will take advantage of the program during the next cycle. Working together we can make Healthy Lakes for current and future generations."
